### **\*\*Land-only passengers – airport arrangements in arrival city**

Passengers who choose to make their own air arrangements may purchase a “land only” package. Upon arrival, these individuals will be responsible for meeting up with the group. If the individuals’ arrival time coincides with the group’s arrival, they may meet up with the group and take the coach from the airport. If not (or if the individuals’ flight is delayed), they must arrange and pay for their own transportation to/from the arrival city’s airport. In other words, the coach will not wait for individuals at the airport who arranged their own flights and they must book and fund their own transportation to and from the destination’s airport if they do not make it there in time to catch the group’s transportation.

The price is subject to the guidelines in the “Terms and Conditions.” The land prices are based on vendor rates available on 9/27/10 and are subject to increases imposed by vendors. The prices and events in this proposal can only be confirmed upon receipt of a tour application and booking of activities. The price is subject to change according to the number of passengers.

Air rates will not be available until 11 months prior to your departure. This estimated airfare is based on a rate available on 7/20/10, and includes estimated air taxes and fuel surcharges. Air taxes and fuel surcharges are subject to change until tickets are issued, approximately 60 days prior to departure.

Hours of operation: 9:00 AM – 10:00 PM
- Royal Hawaiian Center – located on Kalakaua Avenue across the street from International Marketplace.  
Hours of operation: 10:00 AM – 10:00 PM
- Aloha Swap Meet, located at the Aloha Stadium – a taxi may be the best option for transportation and can be coordinated through your hotel. The swap meet is open Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays  
Hours of operation: 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM (admission is \$1.00)

## **Day Four – Wednesday, November 23, 2011**

**National Security at Pearl Harbor – Because Pearl Harbor is an active military base, they strongly enforce the following:** No purses, handbags, fanny packs, backpacks, camera bags, diaper bags, luggage or other items that offer concealment are allowed in the visitor center or on the memorial. Strollers with pockets and compartments must be emptied before being allowed in the visitor’s center. Personal cameras (out of their cases) are allowed, but camera cases are not. Baggage storage is not available and there are no alternatives in the local area for bag storage. Valuables should not be left in parked vehicles in the parking lots. You may not leave any items on your motor coach transfer to the USS Arizona Memorial. Motor coaches will not stand by.

### **USS Arizona Memorial**

The USS Arizona is the final resting place for many of the ship’s 1,177 crewmen who lost their lives on December 7, 1941. The Memorial structure stands over the mid-portion of the sunken battleship.

### **USS Missouri Battleship**

The USS Missouri is the fourth ship and the second battleship to bear the name of the “Show Me” state. The ship was the last battleship commissioned by the USA, and in 1992 was the world’s last operational battleship. The ship provided gunfire support for many famous and important battles of WWII. On September 2, 1945, the ship was chosen to be the stage for the signing of Japan’s Formal Instrument of Surrender, bringing an end to the war.

#### **USS Arizona Memorial**

Your visit to Pearl Harbor includes a 75-minute program that consists of a film depicting events leading up to and attack of Pearl Harbor, and a ferry ride to the Memorial. While at the visitor center, you will have an opportunity to visit the museum, bookstore and waterfront exhibits.

#### **USS Missouri Battleship**

You will be given some time to explore this magnificent battleship on your own. Be sure to locate the spot where the surrender treaty was signed.

#### **Lunch**

A boxed lunch will also be provided on the grounds.

#### **Public Performance**

Enjoy the tribute performance by the Danvers High School Marching Band at the USS Missouri Battleship. There are great areas to view their performance aboard the Battleship.

### Leisure Day

On your own

#### *Free things to do in Waikiki*

Listen to the Royal Hawaiian Band at Iolani Palace on Fridays 12:00-1:00 p.m. and at Kapiolani Park on Sundays from 2:00-3:00 p.m.

Listen to Hawaii's best local entertainers performing at the hotels and on the streets of Waikiki.

Enjoy "Sunset on the Beach," as Kapahulu Pier is transformed into an outdoor movie theater, with live entertainment, food booths, and free Hollywood movies.

Take a stroll through International Marketplace, a bazaar of clothes, jewelry and souvenirs from the island's colorful merchants set under the shade of a large banyan tree.

Stop by Ala Moana Shopping Center's Centerstage, the hub for more than 500 performances annually, from keiki (children) hula to rock, from chorale music to street dancing.

Take ukulele or hula lessons at the Royal Hawaiian Shopping Center.

See a free fireworks show from Waikiki Beach at the Hilton Hawaiian Village on Friday nights.

See the free torch lighting ceremony and hula show at Kuhio Beach Park in Waikiki. You'll find a delightful show filled with traditional Hawaiian music and dancing. The excellent beach side setting can't be beat. This show is presented every Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday nights around sunset (around 6:00pm or 6:30pm) depending on the time of year.

Battery Randolph is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Built in 1911, the massive, steel reinforced concrete structure housed two 14" diameter guns on "disappearing carriages" whose accuracy and range of 11 miles allowed them to outgun any Battleship then afloat. The Battery survived demolition attempts in 1968 and became the home of the U.S. Army Museum of Hawaii in 1976. Its unique construction and architecture are featured through exhibits and adaptive restoration.

Explore the history of Waikiki through old pictures and collectibles that line the grand staircase in the lobby of the Sheraton Moana Surfrider Hotel.

Learn about Princess Kaiulani, Hawaii's last and most beloved princess, on the Princess Kaiulani Historical tour at Sheraton Princess Kaiulani Hotel.

Behold the "Changing of the King's Guard" at 6:15 p.m. daily. The world renowned King's Guard wear uniforms that are the exact replica of those worn by the Hawaiian Royal Palace Guard for King Kalakaua in 1875. Watch as they impress you with a spectacular rifle drill exhibition after retiring the Hawaiian Flag. This free show occurs at the front gate of King's Village.

### Ali'i Kai Catamaran Dinner Sail

Dine, dance and enjoy a Polynesian show on Ali'i Kai, the world's largest Polynesian catamaran, as it carries you into the sunset along the Waikiki shoreline. Take in the Honolulu city lights from its main deck and the bridge above. View Diamond Head on one side and the beautiful Hawaiian sunset on the other. The cruise features a buffet dinner, entertainment and dancing.

### **Day Six – Friday, November 25, 2011**

#### **□ Waikiki Holiday Parade**

2011 marks the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. The Waikiki Holiday Parade commemorates this event each year. The parade is host to local Hawaiian bands, marching bands from the mainland, Pearl Harbor Survivors, service bands, military units, local officials and dignitaries who march in the Waikiki Holiday Parade, paying tribute to this major historical event.

The parade, founded in 1998 by Jake Peppers, is host to thousands of spectators, residents and visitors alike. The parade begins at 7:00 pm at Fort DeRussy, travels down Kalakaua Avenue and is approximately one and one-half miles in length, ending at Kapiolani Park.

## **Optional Activities – Honolulu**

### **Ali'i Kai Dinner Cruise**

The evening starts as Hula dancers welcome you aboard the Ali'i Kai. Once aboard, the staff will look after you as if you were family, so sit back, relax and let the house band entertain. Take in the sunset as you sail along the coastline, you can view the city lights from the main deck or the bridge above. As you enjoy your dinner, dancers, chanters and drummers will entertain you with the story of the Polynesian islands. Following dinner, join the dancers as they invite passengers onto the spacious floor and lead dances from around the world - folk, rock, line dancing and Hawaiian hula.

### **Diamond Head**

Begin a hike that takes you up to the pinnacle of Diamond Head, an extinct volcano. The hike is about 3/4 of a mile up a fairly steep grade. You may want to bring some water for this journey. Often windy and always beautiful, this perch gives you an unobstructed view of Waikiki Beach and downtown Honolulu.

\*This optional activity is regulated by the State of Hawaii; permits are required at 60 passengers per permit, with 2 hours between each permit time.

### **Dole Plantation**

The Pavilion's main attraction is the store selling "pineapple" everything! In the pineapple garden you can see the various kinds of pineapple being grown and learn some fun facts. The Pavilion dares you to attempt the World's Largest Pineapple Garden Maze (admission required).

### **Honolulu City Tour**

This includes a fully narrated tour through Historic Honolulu. Sites include, Punchbowl National Cemetery of the Pacific, Iolani Palace, State Capitol, Washington Place, King Kamehameha Statue and the Kawaiahao Church and Mission Homes.

### **Oahu Makani Catamaran Sailing Adventure**

Set sail on the blue waters of Hawaii and create lasting memories as you cruise the coast alongside dolphins, whales, and sea turtles. Snorkeling will be available and optional for each passenger.

### **Paradise Cove Luau**

Casually stroll through the Hawaiian Village and learn the Arts & Crafts of the islands or test your skills at our Games, also participate in the Hukilau on the Beach and learn the net fishing techniques of old Hawaii. Witness the pageantry of the Royal Court Procession and the time-honored techniques of underground oven cooking at the Imu Ceremony. Bring your appetite to fully enjoy Paradise Cove's extensive menu which tastefully blends the best of traditional Hawaiian dishes, local favorites and continental cuisine. With the most spectacular Hawaiian sunset as a backdrop, our award-winning performers will entertain and amaze you with an unforgettable display of songs and dances of Hawaii and Polynesia.

### **Secret Island**

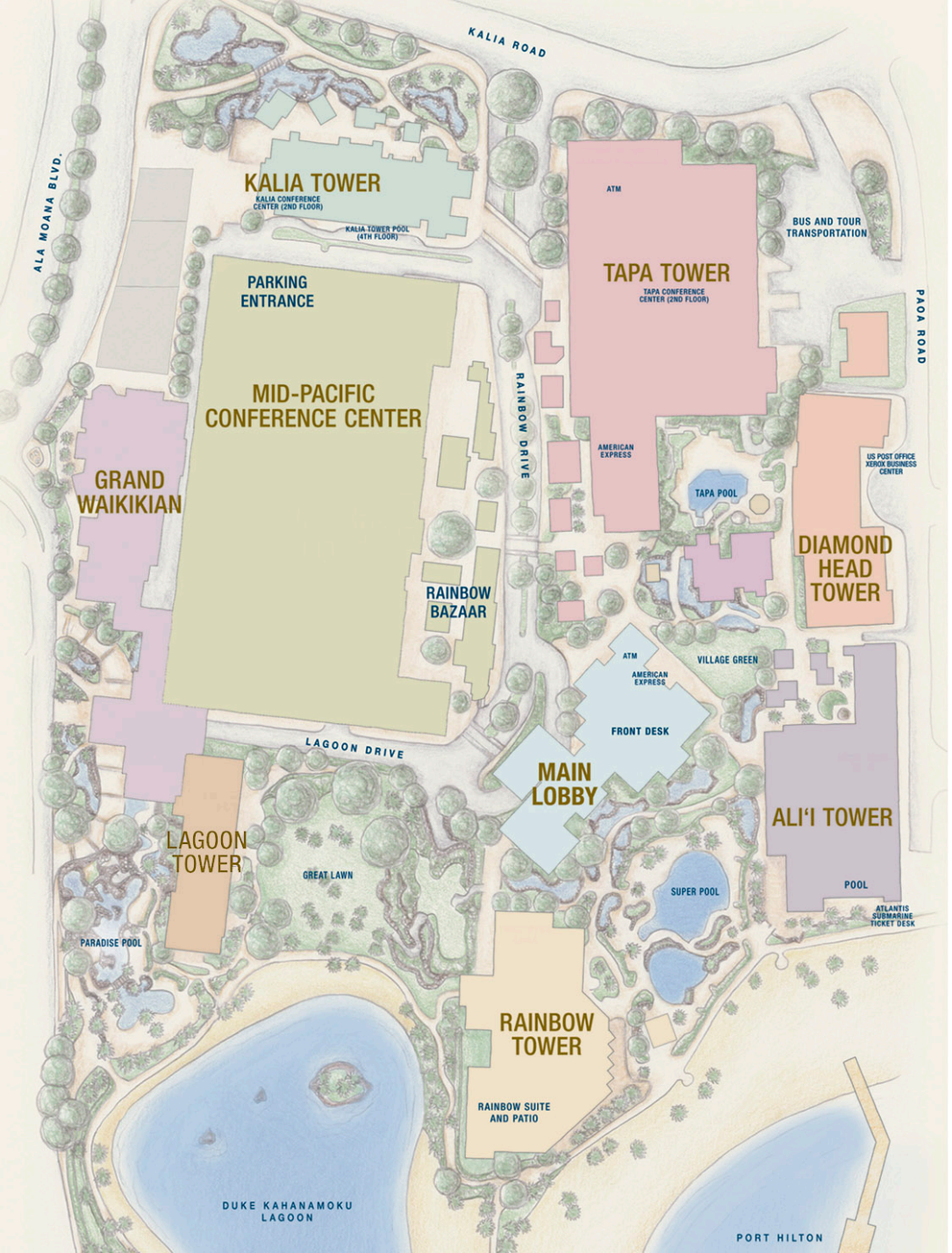

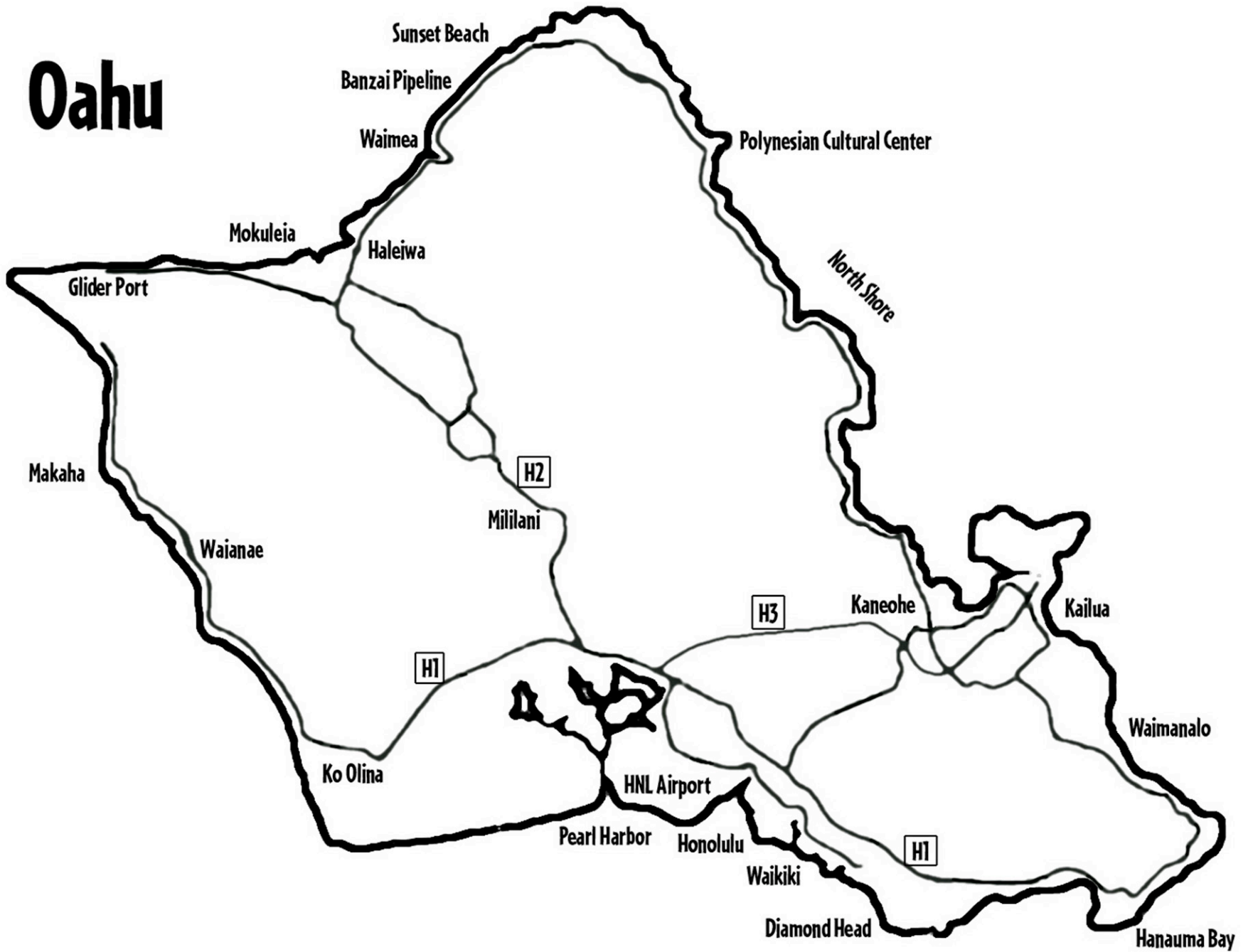
